Zero gravity flight experience is a dream come true for teenager from Puckeridge

Seventeen year old Ben Heraud from Puckeridge near Ware recently had his dearest wish to have a zero gravity flight granted by Starlight Children's Foundation, the UK's leading wish granting charity for children and young people with serious and terminal illnesses.

In 2010, Ben was diagnosed with a rare immunodeficiency disease, which meant that his immune system was unable to fight infectious disease. As a result of his condition, Ben had to undergo a bone marrow transplant, which is a lengthy and complex procedure that required Ben to be in isolation for a long time.

Ben's illness came at a terrible time as it was his GCSE year and a time when a young person's social side of life starts to expand. Despite the huge hurdle he faced, Ben was very brave and never lost his great sense of humour. For a year after his transplant, Ben was mostly confined to his home but, despite this, he was never self-pitying, showing instead an admirable determination to get back to his old ways as soon as possible.

Always a very active child, Ben loves to give everything a go and he enjoys trying new experiences. Before he became unwell, Ben's favourite hobbies were skating, longboarding and skiing and it was very hard for such an energetic teenager to be unable to pursue his interests while he was in hospital.

Ben was referred to Starlight by one of the Clic Sargent nurses at University College Hospital in London where he is treated. It was hard for such an ambitious young man to choose a single wish but, after a lot of thought, he decided that a zero gravity flight experience would be a dream come true!

To make sure that Ben could have the best possible experience, Starlight contacted one of the world experts in weightless flights, Zero Gravity Corporation (ZERO-G). Both Ben and Grace had been booked in for a zero gravity flight and, on the day of the experience, they were very excited and a little nervous! The team at ZERO-G immediately made them feel relaxed and, once in their special flight suits, they began to feel like real astronauts! To do the flight, Ben and Grace had to undergo a short training session, which helped to prepare them for their once-in-a-lifetime weightless experience!

ZERO-G's parabolic flights create the same sensation of a flight in space and Ben and Grace had an amazing time during the experience, floating, flipping and soaring as though they really were in space! They even had their picture taken, with Starlight t shirts on show under their flight suits, as they enjoyed being completely weightless!
